- o <u>Deadline</u>: Concept papers due May 15, 2025
- o Amount: Up to \$350,000 over up to 3 years

Spencer Foundation – Education Research

- o Not Limited
- o <u>Geographical Giving Scope:</u> National & International
- o Deadline: LOI due May 14, 2025
- Amount: \$125,000 \$500,000 over 1-5 years.
- The program is "field-initiated" in that proposal submissions are not in response to a specific request for a particular research topic, discipline, design, method, or location. The foundation anticipates that proposals will span various topics and disciplines and innovatively address questions central to education, including education, anthropology, philosophy, psychology, sociology, law, economics, history, and neuroscience.

Fellowship



o Not Limited



- o **Geographical Giving Scope:** National
- o *Deadline*: May 15, 2025
- Amount: one year of support for the fellow's academic salary and \$10,000 allowance
- Fellows must demonstrate that the fellowship will take place in a new discipline, distinct from their current field of study.
- Fellows and mentors must hold a PhD, MD, or equivalent degree in the natural sciences (astronomy, biology, chemistry, earth sciences, neuroscience, and physics)

Mational Multiple Sclerosis Society - Career Transitioning Fellowships

- o Not Limited
- o **Geographical Giving Scope:** National
- <u>Deadline</u>: Pre applications due May 14, 2025
- o *Amount:* \$600,000 over 5 years.
- The Career Transition Fellowship targets current postdoctoral trainees who demonstrate both commitment and exceptional potential to conduct MS-related research.

Virginia Center for the Creative Arts – Fully-Funded Fellowships

- o Geographical giving scope: National

- Applicants will be considered for a VCCA residency and as many fully-funded fellowships for which they are eligible; only one application with a single application fee is required per deadline.

Pfizer - Diagnosis and Treatment of Cancer Cachexia

- o <u>Deadline</u>: May 13, 2025
- o *Amount:* Up to \$500,000



 The foundation is seeking proposals for independent education initiatives that will improve healthcare professionals' ability to recognize cachexia's signs and symptoms.

Simons Foundation – Autism & Neuroscience Conferences and Courses Awards

 - This grant opportunity aims to train early-career surgeons as principal investigators, perform the primary role in generating the hypothesis, design the experiment, carry it out, and interpret the results with the assistance of an experienced supervisor and/or investigative team.

- Geographical Giving Scope: National

- Funds range up to \$200,000.

Aiming to empower physics departments, educators, and industry leaders to create or expand programs that enhance access, deepen knowledge, and increase opportunities in physics-based climate science education and career pathways.

The Huo Family Foundation – Funding Opportunities

- o *Deadline*: May 23, 2025
- Amount: Total budget of \$13 Million
- The foundation has issued a call for proposals for the effects of the usage of digital technology on brain development, social behaviors, and mental health in children and young people. Application are invited in the following areas:
 - Huo early-career Fellowships: to support talented and promising postdoctoral researchers on the path to independence.
 - Junior Faculty Research grants: to support focused research projects led by new lecturers/assistant professors, who typically took up their first permanent/tenure-track position within the last two years.
 - Special Projects: to allow researchers of all career stages, collaborating as a multi-disciplinary team with different expertise and skills, to take an integrated approach to tackle the more difficult questions in this domain.

Arts

- <u>KRESS Foundation</u> History of Art Grants
 - Not limited
 - o Deadline: LOI due March 1, 2025
 - Awards range between \$10,000 \$100,000
 - The History of Art Grants program supports scholarly projects that will enhance the appreciation and understanding of European works of art and architecture from antiquity to the early 19th century.

Criminal Justice

- <u>Arnold Ventures</u> **Innovation Days**
 - o Not limited
 - Deadline: on a rolling basis
 - This grant aims to bring researchers and practitioners together about solutions to pressing criminal justice problems.
 - This grant will support expenses for hosting meetings, travel/lodging, event deliverable production and personnel time for event planning.
- <u>Arnold Ventures</u> Causal Research on Community Safety and the Criminal Justice System

 - Must check one or more of their priorities:
 - Promoting diversity, equity and belonging
 - Increasing collaboration among future health professionals
 - Prepare future health professionals to navigate ethical dilemmas

Environmental

- <u>Burroughs Wellcome Fund</u> Climate Change and Human Health Seed Grants
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline:</u> October 24, 2024 | January 23, 2025 | April 24, 2025 | July 24, 2025
 - o Ranges from \$2,500 \$50,000
 - o Interested in activities that build connections between basic/early biomedical scientific approaches and ecological, environmental, geological, geographic, and planetary-scale thinking, as well as with population-focused fields, including epidemiology and public health, demography, economics, and urban planning.

Fellowships

- Virginia Center for the Creative Arts Fully-Funded Fellowships
 - Not limited
 - Geographical giving scope: National
 - Deadline: January 15, 2025 | May 15, 2025 | September 15, 2025
 - Applicants will be considered for a VCCA residency and as many fully-funded fellowships for which they are eligible; only one application with a single application fee is required per deadline.

 - This funding is focused on studies about upstream causes of health inequities, such as the systems, structures, laws, policies, norms, and practices that determine the distribution of resources and opportunities.

 - o Not limited
 - <u>Deadline:</u> Proposals for grants up to \$20,000 will be reviewed on a <u>monthly</u> rolling basis.

 - Grant amounts range from \$100k \$600k
 - The foundation is interested in supporting research that aims to build, test, or increase understanding of programs, policies, or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral, or economic outcomes of young people ages 5 to 25.
- <u>William T. Grant Foundation</u> **Officers' Research Grants**
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline:</u> January 8, 2025 & August 6, 2025
 - Grant amounts range from \$25k \$50k
