- PEN America Jean Stein Grants for Literary Oral History
 - o Not Limited
 - Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - o Deadline: June 1, 2025
 - o Amount: two grants of \$15,000
 - The foundation recognizes literary works of nonfiction that use oral history to illuminate an event, individual, place, or movement.
- NAMM Foundation Music Research
 - o Not Limited
 - Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - o <u>Deadline</u>: June 6, 2025
 - o Amount: Range \$5,000 \$25,000
 - The foundation invites applications for its Music Research Grants program that aims to improve practices for music education, support music makers, and enhance workforce development.  - o Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - Deadline: LOI due May 13, 2025
 - o Amount: project costs of up to \$12 Million for up to 5 years.
 - This topical funding announcement is exclusively dedicated to funding highquality, patient-centered comparative clinical effectiveness research projects that address violence and trauma within the following three special areas of emphasis:
 - Intentional Trauma
 - Unintentional Trauma
 - Substance Use and Trauma
- PCORI Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities
 - Not Limited
 - Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - Deadline: LOI due May 13, 2025
 - o Amount: project costs of up to \$12 Million for up to 5 years.



 This opportunity aims to fund the comparison of interventions encountered by individuals of all ages with IDD. Comparisons can be clinical interventions or systems approaches, including pharmacological or non-pharmacological interventions.

- The Anxiety & Depression Initiative, Inc Get out and Get Active Program

 - <u>Deadline</u>: May 30, 2025
 - o Amount: up to \$10,000
 - This grant aims to support innovative projects that explore or promote the mental health benefits of physical activity, including community programs, educational initiatives, and research projects that improve mental health outcomes through movement-based interventions.

- <u>Gilead Sciences</u> Virology & Infectious Diseases
 - Not Limited
 - o Geographical Giving Scope: National & International
 - o Deadline: LOI due May 19, 2025
 - Amount: up to \$200,00
 - Gilead is interested in supporting global research proposals that address, but are not limited to:
 - Innovation and implementation
 - Patient experience and outcomes
- Gilead Sciences SPEARHEAD 2.0 (HDV Research)
 - Not Limited
 - o Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - o Deadline: May 23, 2025
 - Amount: up to \$200,00
 - Chronic hepatitis delta virus (HDV) is the most severe form of viral hepatitis, significantly accelerating liver disease progression among patients infected with hepatitis B virus (HBV), yet it remains widely underdiagnosed due to insufficient



screening. To address this gap, Gilead's SPEARHEAD program supports projects focused on improving HDV screening and linkage to care globally, offering grants up to \$200,000 (larger projects require prior discussion) for initiatives completed within 18 months. Special consideration will be given to regions with high HDV prevalence and available treatments.

• <u>Prostate Cancer Foundation</u> – Therapies for Lethal Forms of Prostate Cancer

- Not Limited
- o Geographical Giving Scope: National & International

- o Amount: up to \$300,000 over 2 years.

- The foundation is interested in studies evaluating interventions to improve patient adherence to oral chemotherapy regimens. The goal is to identify effective strategies that can enhance patient outcomes and reduce the risks associated with nonadherence to oral cancer treatments.

Cancer Research

- o <u>Deadline</u>: May 29, 2025
- Amount: \$250,000 over 2 years.



- The proposed project may be basic, translational, clinical, or population-based research in nature and must have direct applicability and relevance to lung cancer.
- Rheumatology Research Foundation Clinician Scholar Educator Award
 - o <u>Limited</u>
 - Geographical Giving Scope: National
 - o Deadline: June 2, 2025
 - o Amount: up to \$70,000 for three years
 - Education in rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases for future doctors and rheumatology health professionals. Recipients of the award have demonstrated that they want to develop a career in education and are devoted to providing effective and efficient training. Recipients of the CSE award devote themselves to developing products and processes using new technologies and methods to better train future rheumatologists.

 - o Deadline: LOI due March 1, 2025
 - Awards range between \$10,000 \$100,000



 The History of Art Grants program supports scholarly projects that will enhance the appreciation and understanding of European works of art and architecture from antiquity to the early 19th century.

Criminal Justice

- <u>Arnold Ventures</u> **Innovation Days**
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline</u>: on a rolling basis
 - This grant aims to bring researchers and practitioners together about solutions to pressing criminal justice problems.
 - This grant will support expenses for hosting meetings, travel/lodging, event deliverable production and personnel time for event planning.

 - Awards of no more than \$25,000
 - Must check one or more of their priorities:
 - Promoting diversity, equity and belonging
 - Increasing collaboration among future health professionals
 - Prepare future health professionals to navigate ethical dilemmas

Environmental

- <u>Burroughs Wellcome Fund</u> Climate Change and Human Health Seed Grants
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline:</u> October 24, 2024 | January 23, 2025 | April 24, 2025 | July 24, 2025



- Ranges from \$2,500 \$50,000
- o Interested in activities that build connections between basic/early biomedical scientific approaches and ecological, environmental, geological, geographic, and planetary-scale thinking, as well as with population-focused fields, including epidemiology and public health, demography, economics, and urban planning.

Fellowships

- <u>Virginia Center for the Creative Arts</u> Fully-Funded Fellowships
 - Not limited
 - o Geographical giving scope: National
 - Deadline: January 15, 2025 | May 15, 2025 | September 15, 2025
 - Applicants will be considered for a VCCA residency and as many fully-funded fellowships for which they are eligible; only one application with a single application fee is required per deadline.

Health

- WAWA Foundation Financial Grants
 - Not limited
 - Deadline: January, April, July and October
 - LOI related to their areas of focus (Health, Hunger, every day Heroes) can be submitted during the timeframes above. If LOI is approved, additional information may be requested.
- Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Evidence for Action: Innovative Research to Advance Racial Equity
 - o Not limited
 - Deadline: Rolling
 - There is no specific amount range for allowable budget requests.
 - This funding is focused on studies about upstream causes of health inequities, such as the systems, structures, laws, policies, norms, and practices that determine the distribution of resources and opportunities.

Marine

- Waitt Foundation Rapid Ocean Conservation
 - Not limited
 - <u>Deadline</u>: Proposals for grants up to \$20,000 will be reviewed on a <u>monthly</u> rolling basis.



 Will fund projects related to the Waitt Foundation's mission of supporting sustainable fishing and marine protected areas. This includes sub-themes of: Scientific Research, Policy, Management, & Communications.

Medical Research

- Foundation for Prader-Willi Research FPWR Grant Program
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline</u>: LOI due February 28, 2025 & September 5, 2025
 - o May request up to \$150,000 in direct costs for an initial 18 months of support.
 - Aims to eliminate the challenges of Prader-Willi syndrome through the advancement of research and therapeutic development.
- The Elsa U. Pardee Foundation Cancer Research
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline</u>: December 15, 2024 | April 30, 2025 | August 31, 2025
 - Funds ranges up to \$200,000.
 - The foundation encourages one-year proposals, with the goal of fostering the capabilities of new cancer researchers or new cancer approaches by established cancer researchers.
- <u>Impact Fund</u> Advance Social Justice
 - Not limited
 - Deadline: LOIs due April 1, 2025 | July 8, 2025 | October 7, 2025
 - Grant amounts range from \$10k \$50k
 - This foundation grants nonprofit organizations, solo practitioners, or small legal firms that are involved in economic, environmental, racial, and social justice cases that will benefit a community facing systemic oppression.

Sociology

- <u>Sociological Initiatives Foundation</u> Community-Based Participatory Research Projects
 - Not limited
 - o Deadline: August 15, 2025
 - Grant amounts range from \$15k \$25k
 - This proposal is for community-academic partnerships that combine research with concrete social action strategies, prioritizing projects that promote racial justice and equitable laws, policies, and practices.

 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline:</u> January 8, 2025 | May 7, 2025 | August 6, 2025
 - o Grant amounts range from \$100k \$600k
 - The foundation is interested in supporting research that aims to build, test, or increase understanding of programs, policies, or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral, or economic outcomes of young people ages 5 to 25.
- William T. Grant Foundation Officers' Research Grants
 - Not limited
 - o <u>Deadline:</u> January 8, 2025 & August 6, 2025
 - o Grant amounts range from \$25k \$50k
 - The foundation is interested in supporting research that aims to build, test, or increase understanding of programs, policies, or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral, or economic outcomes of young people ages 5 to 25.
